Dear Friends,

Recently, the Parish Pastoral Council and I had a meeting with Bishop Declan and Fr. Vincent to discuss and clarify certain issues about the future of our parish.

The Bishop regrets that because of Fr. John's age and health, it was not possible to arrange, as was formerly hoped, for St. Anthony's and St. Patrick's to share a priest. Fr. Vincent, being some years younger than myself, offered to take responsibility for Melksham as well as Calne. It is the Bishop's wish that we should remain 2 distinct parishes, sharing a priest. For the time being, at least, there will be 2 distinct Parish Pastoral Councils, meeting together perhaps twice a year. The Finance Committees and the finances will remain separate.

As mentioned before, it will only be possible to have one Sunday Mass here, and this will have to be at 9 am to allow Fr. Vincent to return to Calne. This may cause a problem for a few of you, but unfortunately, it cannot be helped. Fr. Vincent has agreed to provide also two weekday Masses each week (except when prevented, eg. by a funeral at Calne), which will probably be at 10 am on Wednesdays and Saturdays, the latter making it possible for Fr. Vincent to provide the Sacrament of Reconciliation after the Mass. These weekday Masses *will not in any way be an alternative* to Sunday Mass; however, as the Bishop points out, if anyone is *genuinely* unable to fulfil an obligation, then the obligation ceases to be binding; and as he says, even weekday Mass is better than no Mass at all! Regarding Easter and Christmas, Fr. Vincent hopes to arrange a supply priest to help with the Vigil/Night Mass, and has already done so for next Christmas & Easter.
