A new course in Youth Ministry - starting 16th January 2020: Facilitated by Clifton Diocese, this opportunity mirrors the Liturgy Course by forming, training and preparing those in our parishes for ministry. Open to all in our parishes, those currently in ministry either through Confirmation, parish youth groups, chaplaincy, first Holy Communion, or those interested in serving young people. Each session is facilitated by experts in the field of Youth Ministry, covering topics such as Confirmation, Scriptural reflections, Catholic Social teaching and forming young disciples. Saturday 18th January - Catechists' Day, St Brendan's College Bristol: We welcome David Wells back to the Diocese to help us explore what it means to 'share our story'. In addition to his two talks, there will be a range of workshops on offer which will help new and experienced catechists and evangelists to engage more

These will include: First Communion Preparation, Accompanying parents, Confirmation catechesis, Sharing our Story – Alpha, Baptismal Preparation, Liturgy and Catechesis and Sacramental Rites. This is part of the preparation for this year which marks the start of 'Behold, Your Mother' when the people of England are being invited to dedicate themselves to Mary, Mother of Jesus, in 2020. Faith in Politics - an internship run by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales: Bishop John Arnold on behalf of the Bishop's Conference of England and Wales, has written a letter: 'We are looking to recruit six Catholic graduates to work for 11 months from September 2020 to July 2021 in Parliamentary and Public Affairs posts. The interns will be selected on the basis of ability and potential to gain most from the experience. The interns will all live together, with 70 other students, in More House, a Catholic Chaplaincy and Student Centre in Central London. Financial support will be provided to cover living and travel costs for the duration of the internship.
