This is perishable food that would be thrown away. They want to send the message out to young families, families in need and anyone suffering from the cost-of-living crisis, but they are happy for anyone to come along and collect food. Just pop along on Mondays and Thursdays to that meeting place in the Market Place from 4.15pm.

To remember someone, please take a blank leaf/leaves from the tray in the porch, sign their name(s) on the leaf and put it in the relevant tray, for display on the tree. Time to start school? If you have a child born between 1st September 2018 and 31st August 2019, then now is the time to apply for a place at a Catholic primary school in the Diocese. You must complete an application form (either online or on paper) that is available from the school admissions team of Wiltshire Council, for admission during the 2023-24 school year. If your child has been baptised, you must also provide a copy of the baptism certificate to your preferred school. Our parish school is St Patrick's Catholic Primary School, Corsham –
