#### Fourth week of Lent

Trust in providence; Luke 16-24

This passage begins with the man who had such a good crop he planned to build new barns to store and ends with the 'lilies of the field' in the Matthew version. This might be seen as a criticism of the culture that demands infinite growth in a finite planet. As David Attenborough said, the person who believes this is possible is either mad or an economist! Modern technology has, as the Pope says in Laudato Si, brought so many benefits and so much beauty, but has also led to our using up the resources of the planet quicker than they can be replenished.
