PEACE SUNDAY: Today is Peace Sunday, and this year the message from Pope Francis is: 'No one can be saved alone. Combatting Covid-19 together, embarking together on paths of peace'. A vaccine has been found for Covid-19, says the Holy Father, but we still need to tackle the virus of war, and of inequality, and this can only be done **together.** The Catholic peace movement Pax Christi aims at working together to promote peace through parishes, schools and social
