Dear Friends,

In my home parish of my youth we had an eccentric sacristan who lived with an aunt who was a seamstress. He would choose some beautiful material and get her to make vestments for the church – before consulting the parish priest! It was good to have beautiful vestments – the Church's detractors imply that priests should dress in rags so all the money can go to the poor. But do most of us dress in rags? Don't we have good clothes for daily use, special clothes for more formal occasions, and still better ones for parties, weddings, etc? So why should we expect the worship of God to be conducted in rags? Why should not the presider at liturgy have, within reason, different vestments for different occasions? Jesus rebuked the disciples when they complained about the woman who poured expensive ointment over him to honour him instead of giving the money to the poor.

So within reason we should use good quality vestments etc. in worship. But this sacristan went too far. He provided so many vestments the parish priest had to have an extra wardrobe built in his office, adjacent to the sacristy, to house them all! I used to help in the sacristy in those days; selecting the right vestments from so many for the next day's celebration was a skill akin to that of a butler in the old stately homes selecting the right wine for the right food and occasion! So in the end the sacristan cost the parish too much and had to leave! Yes, we should if possible use good quality articles in worship; but the Church guidelines say that the church collection is "for the poor and for the needs of the Church." Let us honour God in worship, but let us also honour him in our service of the poor! It is a balance that is needed rather than one extreme against another!
