## **Resignation of Bishop Declan and Appointment of New Bishop**

On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> March, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, accepted the resignation of the Right Reverend Declan Lang as Bishop of Clifton. Rev. Canon Bosco MacDonald, a priest of the Diocese of Clifton, has been appointed as the tenth Bishop of the Diocese of Clifton. The Episcopal Ordination of Bishop-Elect MacDonald will take place in the Cathedral Church of Saints Peter and Paul in Clifton, Bristol. The date will be announced in due course.
