### **SUNDAY 18 MARCH, 2018**

Dear Friends,

A week ago Fr. Vincent Curtis, parish priest of St. Edmund's, Calne, visited Bp Declan, who asked him to take on responsibility for St. Anthony's parish as well as for St. Edmund's from September.

I know that we asked to be "twinned" with St. Patrick's parish, and that when a priest retired or was moved, it was expected that we would link up with them. St. Patrick's is 2-3 miles closer to us than St. Edmund's, and the road easier; and we share a school. However, Fr. John is not in good health, and older than I am, and he made it clear at one of our joint meetings that he would not be capable of extra Masses, more travelling, and so on; so joining with St. Patricks was no longer really an option, though it is a shame that our sharing in meetings and activities is not able to bear the fruit that we had hoped. I think at that time we had assumed that my health would outlast Fr. John's and that I would take responsibility for both parishes; unfortunately that was not to be.

The bishop's wish is for us to form a joint PPC with Calne; but for the finances to remain separate. We will probably need a part-time secretary to deal with correspondence, newsletters, etc. We will only be able to have one Sunday Mass, and that at 9 am because of Fr. Vincent having to get back to Calne, We should have plenty of space for everyone at one Mass, though the time might be a problem for the sick and elderly and disabled. Fr. Vincent is going to look at the possibility of getting permission for a later Mass one day each week which would take the place of a Sunday Mass for the sick and disabled. Let us keep our parishes in our prayer at this time that everything may work out well for us. We have a good little parish here; let us pray that with all the upheaval we may remain united and continue to carry out to the best of our ability our mission from God.


