Dear Friends,

Since my last newsletter we have heard the devastating news about Downside and Ampleforth and the child abuse that has happened there.

When I was at school, pupils from a neighbouring school caught the same bus as we did. Because one or two of them misbehaved, we were inclined to think the whole school bad! And it can be the same when some evil is perpetrated in the Church. The "bad name" is inclined to rub off on the whole Church, or as in this case, the whole monastery. And there is a certain malice in the press which would like to blacken the whole of the Catholic Church. But the truth is that there is a lot of good that happens in and through the Catholic Church, and in and through these two monasteries, and we must keep focussed on that. Several of us for example know Fr. Michael from Downside, and know him to be a good and sincere priest; and this I am sure applies to all those monks remaining there; Cardinal Hume was from Ampleforth, and Dom Henry Wansborough, editor of the New Jerusalem Bible & writer of the Wednesday Word who I am sure were/are both above reproach; and no doubt this applies to the monks who now remain there.

Nevertheless, what has been done by the few is evil. Not only does it seriously impair the mission of the Church; it destroys the lives of the victims! Children are precious, and they and all the vulnerable have a right to feel safe - most of all in the Church. Let us do all we can to ensure that they do so. Let us pray that in future all may feel safe in the Church; let us pray for the victims, for the monks who remain at these abbeys; and let us even pray for such perpetrators who are still alive, that they may repent of the great harm they have done.
