#### Did you know?

St Aldhelm was a monk of Malmsbury. In c675 he became abbot and made foundations at Frome and Bradford-on-Avon. When the Wessex diocese was divided in 705, he became the first bishop of the western half, Sherborne. He died at Doulting in Somerset and was buried at Malmsbury.
