## **SUNDAY 22 APRIL. 2018**

### Dear Friends.

I don't know whether I was really safe to drive along the M4 on my way back to Swindon one Saturday in mid-late November 1974, a week or two after my ordination. I was terrified at the thought of having to hear confessions as soon as I got back! It is a fear I have never completely got over in over 43 years; though the sense of satisfaction one experiences of a sincere confession of someone genuinely seeking to love God, and the privilege and joy of being able to tell them they are loved and forgiven outweighs the difficulties experienced in the Sacrament! And it is the same with other aspects of the priest's ministry; the good aspects compensate for and outweigh the difficult aspects. It has not all been easy; but in general I have been very happy.

But people sometimes ask, "Don't you get lonely?" and in all seriousness, I have to say, no. Okay, there may be odd moments, like a couple of years or so ago when I was ill, and could not cope with visitors, but felt a bit distanced from what was going on in the parish. But otherwise, no. If my ministry became so activity- and "me"- centred that I imagined I did not have time for God or for prayer, then I probably would be. Or if I was foolish enough to imagine that my ministry made me some kind of superior being to the people of the parish that I could not relate to them in any meaningful way, then again I probably would be. But the people of the parish have usually been kind and supportive, a sort of extended family. And I am conscious that God is very good to me and is always close to me- Father, Son, and Holy Spirit -; so there is no reason to be lonely.

Over the years I have been as happy, and probably happier, than most people in other callings; as I near retirement please pray that many more younger people will discover the happiness of this ministry and want to offer themselves in this way in the service of God and of his Church.

**24 HOUR EUCHARISTIC ADORATION Thursday 17th May 10am to Friday 18th May 9am**, This period of silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament for 24 hours has a three-fold purpose.

1.To pray in preparation for the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress to be held in Liverpool from 7th - 9th September 2018 Eucharistic Congresses are gatherings of clergy, laity and religious which promote an awareness of the central place of the Eucharist in the life and mission of the Church. The last International Eucharistic Congress in England was held in 1908 when permission for a public procession of the Blessed Sacrament was refused. The Deanery Clergy have organised a programme of Eucharistic Adoration in the week 14th to 20th May 2018. Most of the parishes within the Deanery are taking part and having a period of Adoration on an allotted day that week.

2. "Thy Kingdom Come" This is an invitation from the Presidents of Churches Together in England to join again this year in a global wave of prayer for mission, evangelism, peace and justice. People around the world will be coming together to pray for family friends and neighbours to come to know Jesus Christ.

3. As we approach Pentecost to pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit anew on our parish and its future when Fr. Richard retires.

This time of silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament will be part of our regular weekly Eucharistic Adoration and already have cover from 10am to 7pm We are asking many more parishioners to sign up to an hourly slot to ensure that two people are praying before the Blessed Sacrament at all times for the 24 Hrs. Please sign up on the spread sheet in the church porch.

**LIFTS TO/FROM MASS:** Anyone willing to offer lifts to/from Mass when required, please let Mary Harris know.

**PARKING:** a) Could those parking on the corner of the car park please pull in tightly?
