Dear Friends,

I very much enjoy our flower arrangements in the church. We have some very talented flowerarrangers who work hard on their arrrangements; sadly, after all that work, as I was thinking only this week as I was admiring the flowers, they last only for a few days! Even things that are made to last longer don't last for ever. When I was 13, beginning what would now be Year 9, St. Brendan's College moved from central Bristol in Berkeley Square to the present site in Broomhill Road, Brislington. And yet in less than 50 years, that building was knocked down and replaced by the present one. Not that I have any nostalgic memories of the building whatsoever! In fact my thought was that they probably found it impossible to scrub away the pupils' blood remaining from the time of the so-called Christian Brothers! But it just goes to show how even things that are built to be more permanent don't last forever.

Of course, it is right to use our talents; and we need to build schools and houses and other buildings, even if they do not last for ever. But if we spend so much time and effort building things that do not last, how much more time should we spend working towards those things that will last for ever? – or if we fail to work on, we will miss out on for ever? Nothing in this life will last beyond this life, if even that long – except, of course, as St. Paul says, faith, hope and love; the greatest of these being love. While not necessarily neglecting other things, let us put our major effort in those things that are going to last beyond death. We will all live for ever, no matter what we do; but only if we work towards it will that eternal life be with God; and eternity without God is a thing that does not bear thinking about!
