Listening with the Heart' - Clifton Diocese Synodal Response: On Wednesday 22nd June, our diocesan family joyfully gathered at the cathedral. Bishop Declan invited every parish, school, and religious order to an Evening Liturgy and presented the Clifton Diocesan Synodal report. In his reflection, Bishop Declan focused on the overarching themes that emerged from the many responses that the Synod team received. He encouraged us all to see the Synodal journey as a new way to move forward and grow as a Church within Clifton Diocese. Diocesan Pilgrimage to Glastonbury – Sunday 10th July: We are pleased to confirm the Annual Pilgrimage to Glastonbury, led by Bishop Declan, is taking place again this year on the second Sunday in July; Sunday 10th July 2022. The theme of this year's pilgrimage is `Mary, Queen of Peace'. From 12 noon until 3.00pm, the Shrine Church will become a chapel of Exposition and Silent Adoration. Also from 12 noon until 3.00pm the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Private Healing Prayer will be offered. The Rosary procession will, start in the Abbey grounds at 2.15pm, and the pilgrimage Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Declan at 3.30pm
