Prayers for the King: The Presidents of Churches Together in England invite all Christians to join together in a period of daily prayer for both the King and the nation, from Easter Day to 6th May. The Church of England is publishing a book of Daily Prayers for the Coronation of King Charles III, which can be used as a guide to reflection, and can be ordered via Coronation Prayers (chpublishing.co.uk) The Presidents comment that "The Coronation will be a time to celebrate community, faith and service – values that are reflected in these prayers."

How Can You Help Rough Sleepers? A Message from Wiltshire Council: If you see someone on the streets, you can provide details to StreetLink which connects rough sleepers with local services that can support them. StreetLink will provide the council with details so officers can talk to the rough sleeper, help them find a warm place to stay and offer ongoing support.
