Dear Friends,

There was a story in one of my previous parishes that in my predecessor's time while they were preparing for the Easter Vigil one year, an altar server, (obviously not as nicely behaved as *our* altar servers!), in the absence of the priest had seized the paschal candle and used it as a weapon against a fellow altar server, and it had got broken! (I can't remember now how they got around that to celebrate the Vigil!) It is a reminder of how we can use what God has created, and what we have made from what he has created, either for good or for evil! We remember the famous passage from Isaiah, "they will hammer their swords into ploughshares, their spears into sickles" (Isaiah 2:4); there is also the opposite of this in the prophet Joel, "Hammer your ploughshares into swords, your sickles into spears"(Joel 4:10).

Sadly we have been hearing only recently how, especially in London, knife crime is on the increase. Knives are very useful instruments in the kitchen; but they can be deadly weapons when used against other people. As Christians we are called upon to use God's creation for good, and especially for spiritual good; and to inspire other people to do the same. This is symbolised above all by the sacraments, where we use ordinary things of God's creation to bring about the spiritual good of the Church's members and prospective members – water, bread, wine, oil, to initially bring about, and to increase the effectiveness and growth of. the new life in Christ that God has given us through his Holy Spirit. May the sacraments always inspire us in other ways too to use the good things that God has created for us to bring about good, and to encourage others to do the same..
