## Second week of Lent

Many people are warning of the fragility of the planet under human pressure and the need for change. We might consider this story in that context.

The parable of the Mustard Seed; Mark 4.30

The mustard seed produces a huge bush that shelters the birds. Life also emerges from tiny beginnings and the whole web of life supports all life, from insects and microbes to animals, fish, birds and people. What if the tree is shaken, so that branches are broken off, leaves ripped from the branches? This is not in

the parable but is what is happening to our world. It no longer provides reliable seasons in many places, and indeed many people are suffering from repeated 'natural disasters' now, attributable by scientists to human activity. How sad this is.

Youth Ministry - A 'Million Minutes of Silence': This is a simple idea - each minute is sponsored to raise money for social action projects supporting young people. Throughout Lent schools, parishes, and individuals will help clock up a million minutes! We want this year to be the biggest year yet, to show our collective support for young people, and to raise at least a million pennies (which is £10,000!) to help young people restore our world.
