Refreshments in the hall after Mass Next week: Retiring Collection for the Priests' Retirement Fund

The Diocese currently pays out about £300,000 per year to support our sick and retired priests. Last year the second collections for this fund raised £29,226; clearly, a very significant shortfall. This collection was also over £30,000 down on the pre-pandemic year of 2019. Hence, the criticality of having this second collection in all our parishes and of supporting it.

Did you know?

One billion people speak English – that is on in every 7 on earth.

Australia was inhabited by Indigenous people for about 50,000 years before the British arrived.

Charles Lwanga and his companions were martyrs of Uganda who died between 1885 and 1887. This group of 22 Africans reproached the ruler Mwanga for his debauchery and for murdering a Protestant missionary bishop. Mwanga, bitterly opposed to Christianity gathered all his pages together and Christians were ordered to separate themselves from the others. Fifteen – all under 25 years old – did so. They were later joined by 2 others already under arrest, and also 2 soldiers. They were killed on Mwanga's orders near Kampala.
