Liturgies of Reconciliation: Bishop Declan will celebrate Liturgies of Reconciliation during the Season of Lent at four venues across the diocese. Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> March (Sacred Heart, Westbury-on-Trym, Bristol), Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March (St Catharine of Alexandria, Frome), Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> March (St Mary, Swindon), Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> March (Our Lady of Lourdes, Weston-Super-Mare). Each Liturgy will start at 7pm; except for Sacred Heart, Westbury-on-Trym, which will start at 6pm. Clifton Mercy Group: The Mercy Group was formed at Clifton Cathedral during Pope Francis' Year of Mercy in 2016 to support those suffering from issues affecting their mental health. The Mercy Group is a non-professional group offering talking and listening support for those who need it especially when professional help is not readily available. The group supports those with low mood, anxiety, isolation, addiction, low selfesteem, family issues, mental or physical trauma, ongoing or terminal illness, bereavement and all life-affecting issues. Practical support can also be given in relation to accommodation, benefit applications, assistance finding paid or voluntary work etc. The group meets every Wednesday at 7pm in the James Room at Clifton Cathedral. Those attending have the opportunity to talk about their issues how this is affecting their lives and to receive gentle support from other attendees. Everyone attending is given the space to talk but do not have to if they are not ready to

open up. In addition to the group and one to one meetings **telephone support is offered Monday to Friday up until 10pm.** The group also arranges social events once a month at the Cathedral.
