Covid-19 Procedures: The PPC met on Wednesday 26th May to review step 3 Covid Guidance procedures provided by the Diocese. It was agreed that the following could start immediately;

Votive candles will be returned to the church

Prayers of the faithful

It is important to remind everyone that social distancing, face masks, hand sanitising and good ventilation practices must continue, along with the one-way system in church. This relaxation of procedures is dependent upon the prevailing local conditions of the virus, and may be suspended if the rate of transmission in our area increases. The PPC continue to investigate further steps, such as increasing the capacity of the church, etc.

Pentecost Prayers: Pentecost Prayers will be at the back of the church. Paper "flames" are placed on the board to display your prayers. Coloured paper "flames" are available in church for you to take away, write a short prayer, and then return them to be added to the display. If you are unable to attend church, please send flames to Sharon (using the email at the foot of the newsletter, leave a message on the parish answer phone, or pop them through the presbytery door) who will write a flame for you. Please do not add flames to the display yourself; this will compromise our Covid infection control systems.
