CLIFTON DIOCESE NEWS

Step out against Climate Change: Walking now towards Clifton Diocese are a group of pilgrims, part of a relay on a 5-month journey. They set off from Cornwall earlier this month, and are on their way via Clifton Diocese & London, for Glasgow - more than 600 miles. This extraordinary event has been organised by a group of young Christians (the Young Christians Climate Network). A wide range of volunteers are needed to greet walkers; walk part of the way; offer refreshments; cheer the walkers on; and other capacities. People of all ages, and from all churches, are urged to get involved in this walk for climate justice. Closest stage of the route to us - Monday 19th July, Bath - Trowbridge; 20th July, Trowbridge - West Lavington. Details available are on the YCCN website: **RELAY | YCCN**.

Pro-Life Mass Lobby: Please meet your MP to lobby against DIY abortion and assisted suicide. SPUC is holding a Mass lobby of MPs on Friday 16th

July or Saturday 17th July 2021. We are asking prolife supporters up and down the country to organise a meeting with their MP, at the constituency office on one of these dates. The DIY abortion policy is still in place, and there is a renewed threat of assisted suicide being legalised. Please ask your MP to lobby the Health Secretary to end DIY abortion. Now that Covid restrictions are easing, Melksham Family of Churches want to intensify their work on the initiatives below. This does need help from all of Melksham' Christian community to succeed and volunteers are very welcome: Melksham Foodbank are looking for Trustees to support registration with the Charity Commission. Melksham Community Money Advice (formerly Hope Debt Advice) is now in alignment with the national Community Money Advice organisation, and needs office support and trained advisors in the next 6-12 months to support those struggling with debt. Messy Church, based at Forest and Sandridge School, plans to reopen on a face to face basis in September - help with sessions will be welcome. Plans for a Melksham Job Club are in very early stages, but people who have the skills to help others search and apply for jobs will be needed. Open the Book is a Bible Society initiative and groups from

Melksham churches have been taking this to 3 of our town's primary schools. More team members are needed to continue and perhaps extend the number of schools visited. If you can give help any of these Christian projects in Melksham, please contact Sharon in the parish office for further details.
