Dear Friends,

As I mentioned inside this newsletter, we all need more of the Holy Spirit's power in our lives. We simply cannot live a Christian life without him. We may be living what we imagine to be a "Christian life" by our own power, but it will have little to do with the life to which Christ has actually called us. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit is something we must seriously seek and pray for. We may think we have the Holy Spirit through Baptism and Confirmation, and indeed, we have been *given* the Holy Spirit, but that is different from having *received* him. I may *give* you a gift, wrapped; but if you toss it in a cupboard, unopened, you have not really *received* it. It is only when you have unwrapped it and allowed it to make a difference to your life that you have received it.

Jesus, and his Holy Spirit, do not force their way into our lives; we have to welcome them. "Look, I am standing at the door, knocking. If one of you hears me calling and opens the door, I will come in..." It is only with their power working in us that we can live the kind of life Jesus wants of us. Some people think that there are 2 levels of Christian faith that are valid; one of deep commitment, another of a more casual involvement. This is not true. A casual involvement is not really Christian life at all; if we try living on that level we will not only probably lose out in eternal life, but will lose out in this life as well. There is a joy in living the Christian life that we do not recognise if we stay "on the edge". Like in a swimming pool – from the edge the water may seem cold and uninviting; but once you are in the pool and have adjusted to it, the hardest thing is to get out again! So with the Christian life; you only discover the joy of it by getting fully immersed in it. For this we need the Holy Spirit. So do join in with the Novena, and the 24 hour Adoration praying for the Holy Spirit on 17 May, that he may come more deeply into your life and that of the whole parish.

24 HOUR EUCHARISTIC ADORATION Thursday 17th May 10am to Friday 18th May 9am: This period of silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament for 24 hours has a three-fold purpose.

- 1.To pray in preparation for the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress to be held in Liverpool from 7th 9th September 2018 Eucharistic Congresses are gatherings of clergy, laity and religious which promote an awareness of the central place of the Eucharist in the life and mission of the Church. The last International Eucharistic Congress in England was held in 1908 when permission for a public procession of the Blessed Sacrament was refused. The Deanery Clergy have organised a programme of Eucharistic Adoration in the week 14th to 20th May 2018. Most of the parishes within the Deanery are taking part and having a period of Adoration on an allotted day that week.
- 2. "Thy Kingdom Come" This is an invitation from the Presidents of Churches Together in England to join again this year in a global wave of prayer for mission, evangelism, peace and justice. People around the world will be coming together to pray for family friends and neighbours to come to know Jesus Christ.
- 3. As we approach Pentecost to pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit anew on our parish and its future when Fr. Richard retires.

This time of silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament will be part of our regular weekly Eucharistic Adoration and already have cover from 10am to 7pm We are asking many more parishioners to sign up to an hourly slot to ensure that two people are praying before the Blessed Sacrament at all times for the 24 Hrs. Please sign up on the spread sheet in the church porch.
