Dear Friends,

"Carelessness costs lives". Wasn't this one of the wartime slogans on posters? We might apply this to the events in Amesbury in the last few days – or at least, the way they appear to be at present. It would seem that the discarding of the receptacle containing the nerve agent used on the father and daughter in Salisbury recently was so careless that other people have now been affected by it. Not that we could in any way condone the earlier incident in Salisbury, but the apparent carelessness in discarding the container has had further dire consequences. And even if the perpetrator had any kind of conscience, which seems unlikely, and now regretted his or her carelessness – it is too late now to undo what has been done!

What we do carelessly can also have disastrous emotional and pschological consequences on others – what we say and do to them, for example; and perhaps especially on children; even things said or done inadvertently rather than deliberately can cause lasting hurt or harm. I know, for example, that a number of things said and done to me during my childhood – not just by parents, but by other adults: teachers, relatives, perhaps priests(?!!!) and even fellow pupils, and so on, had a detrimental effect lasting well into adulthood on my own self-esteem and self-confidence. We may think of words as "just words" but they can be very harmful. St. James says, "Think how small a flame can set fire to a huge forest; the tongue is a flame too." (James 3:5-6) Let us try to watch our tongues, and our actions, so that our carelessness may not cause irreparable harm to others!
